Projects

Call and Response at Affordable art Fair, Battersea Park March 2013

'Call and Response' is an interactive light and sound artwork which references different levels of communication. The piece was installed at the front entrance to the Affordable Art Fair and Viewers experienced the movement of sound and light across the gap between two groups of lit shapes. This movement is inspired by Chiasma, a genetic term, thought to be the point of chromosomal crossover where genetic material is exchanged between chromosomes.

Created specifically for the entrance to the recent 100% Design exhibition by artists Neil Musson and I created 'Collider', an extraordinary light installation composed of suspended LED Light Sheet shapes and inspired by neural systems responding to electrical signals and by mycelia (an intricate fungal network spreading nutrients across vast areas). Sculptural shapes refer to the silent communication between birds in flight.

A magical sound, sculpture and light installation celebrating Surrey's landscape and wildlife. My role was one of the Lead Artists and Production Manager and was Made in partnership with Debi Retallick, Mary Branson and Mat Clark.

During the project we delivered workshops to 15 community groups and had well over 3,000 visitors the week following the Relay event.

Supernature was commissioned for Guildford's Olympic Torch Relay event on Friday 20 July and was funded by Arts Council England, Guildford Borough Council, Surrey County Council, University of Surrey, Guildford Arts and Farnham Town Council.

My role included helping coordinate teams in preparation of furnaces for the event and 'charge crew captain' during the live performance.

As project manager and lead Artist I facilitated a public mould making workshop which ran alongside a performance iron pour at Surreys first large scale arts festival at Loseley Park, Guildford. The metal monkey artists were mentored in running their furnace as a 'tap out' furnace and mould making for the performance element of the project.

Metal Monkeys secured a Grant for the Arts (ACE) to set up a transportable foundry facility for developing the arts practice of its members & working with the community. As part of the management committee I was involved in project Management & delivery of the following:

- A casting workshop for 12 artists that also enabled them to take part as crew in an Iron Pour.
- 103 new cast iron sculptures were made as a result of this project that included the involvement of a local school and arts organisations Creative Response & Art Scape, creating 40 cast iron medals based on the theme of inspiration.
- The launch of Metal Monkeys, with our first community arts event, featuring a Public Iron Pour with an attendance of 305 people.

As part of a county wide project, I was commissioned by Surrey County Arts and funded by Arts Council England to respond to the unique surrey landscape. I was interested in the way we protect areas of natural beauty and, in the case of the North Downs Way, how the land was used to protect the capital during World War II. Snail Trail comprised sculptures based on the endangered Desmoulin Whorl snail species, and were deployed within the pillboxes at Moor Park for a two month period.

Colebrook Chronicles Project 'Colebrook Nameseeds' Surrey Integrated Arts Consortium, November 2007

I was commissioned by The Colebrook Day Centre in Redhill and Surrey Integrated Arts Consortium to produce a series of cast iron sculptural works. The works are a memorial to those who are and have been part of the community of the day centre and were produced in collaboration with service users from the day service. The work was exhibited at the day centre from 5th to the 27th June 2008.

Creative Partnerships

Slated Row School, Milton Keynes, June – November 2009

This project involved working across the different ages of the school, in tandem with a creative partner. We helped the students and staff to explore new ways of learning using the arts and scientific approaches together. We used Darwin's research as a beginning and helped the group to look at their environment in a different way, creating images and sculpture based on their 'evolved' drawings and sculptures.

The Misbourne School, Great Missenden, November 2007 – June 2008

My role with another creative partner was to facilitate a creative way for the students to explore 'spaces' around the school. We used performance, sculpture and film to help them think differently about art and it's place in learning. Students and teachers alike reflected on the value of process lead learning. Outcomes included a final performance for the participants, a temporary sculpture and a series of short film interviews.

Residencies

Creative Therapy @ Farmfield Priory Hospital, Charlwood, October 2007 – March 2011

Working with forensic mental health patients and occupational therapists on a weekly basis I facilitate group projects as well as providing a framework for individual work with five wards across the hospital.

I currently lead 2 sessions a week facilitating the creative development of participants, providing direction and stimulus out of my own art practice and training.

In February 2008 i was invited to pilot a project with Wycombe museum and Wycombe Homeless Connection. Over a period of three sessions the participants used photography and printmaking to create small books reflecting their experiences, the work was exhibited in the museum. Following the success of this first project we have continued, March 2009 - papier mache sculpture, January 2010 – three dimensional collages, February 2011 – portrait photography and March 2012 – portrait photography development.

Surrey Probation Service, January 2004 – October 2008

I was commissioned to run a series of workshops with residents at St. Catherine's Priory in Guildford. These workshops have focused on introducing various art disciplines; sculpture, portrait and landscape work, mark making, printmaking and encaustic wax painting.

Creative Therapy @ Hartsleap Hospital, Sandhurst, September 2007 – January 2008

I worked as a 'creative Therapist' with dementia patients and patients with severe and enduring mental health. I work closely with the Occupational Therapists and activity co-ordinators to engage patients in their own creativity.

Two residencies for one week helping 1st and 2nd yr BA students with sand mould making. Pour crew for the 'Day of the Dead' iron pour in October. In March I was pour captain during the culminating pour.

Voice Box was a project commissioned by Spelthorne council aiming to conduct quality consultation with as many young people living in the borough as possible, during an event called Urban Games. My role was to support and encourage the young people in running the workshop.

As part of Arts Exchange I was involved in providing arts based facilitation as part of a foundation programme on social inclusion for people with mental health and learning difficulties, substance misuse, older and young people's services. The programme aimed to promote self expression and confidence building and through bringing people together provide a place where group identity could be explored and the voice of the service user heard.

At the Apple Orchard School, Bramley I worked with young people with behavioural difficulties. The project; The Singing Bowl, gave the students the opportunity to work with ceramics, freehand machine embroidery and encaustic wax painting to produce a large collaborative piece and series of smaller works. I co-ordinated the residency and mentored a recent graduate in the running of the workshop.

Art in the Arboretum- August 2004

An outdoor arts and craft event, I worked alongside other artists where I made a large weaving in the forest with members of the general public, children and adults.

The Bridge Youth & Community Centre, Leatherhead, February & October 2003

A series of one-day workshops as part of the 'Create' event exploring the themes of 'mark making', graffiti and Sculpture working with youth from the local area.

Vigo Junior School, Andover, June 2002

A three dimensional workshop, working on the theme of bugs and butterflies for year 7 & 8 pupils as part of the arts week programme of activities.

I was commissioned to hand paint 15 pairs of Dr Marten boots worn by dancers for the Rugby World Cup opening ceremony in Wales.

I completed two main contracts during this period resulting in the design and production of over 300 original works of art for window display. The works produced involved textile and metal work processes and were installed in the flagship stores of London and Paris.

As assistant technician I gained experience in the general maintenance of the gallery space; lighting, framing and art handling. During my contract I was also involved in special projects such as the construction of the 'Paul Smith' show.
